PROGRAM DETAILS & TERMS OF AGREEMENT

EXPECTATIONS AND COSTS

Lessons are timetabled once per week and rotated through regular timetabled classes. Students in Yea
11/12 will be allocated a fixed lesson time to coincide with any free study periods. Students must be
punctual to lessons, rehearsals and performances to ensure thorough preparation of performance studies.
Students must attend all scheduled lessons and in the event of absence for reasons other than school
activities, a note or email from parents to the instrumental teacher or Director of Music is required
Continued absence may result in the cessation of lessons.
Students can choose to enrol for AMEB or other external examinations (fees apply).
Students will be given ensemble music as part of the tuition fee but must have a folder to hold and retain
this music for relevant performances.
We recommend that all students choosing to play in ensembles take instrumental lessons with the college
instrumental teachers to help maintain standards in their music education.
Students will need to purchase instrument tutor books when required and additional reeds, drum sticks
practice diary etc. This is an additional cost and is not included in lesson fees.
Students are expected to practise regularly with at least twenty minutes to one half hour per day devoted to

developing their performance skills in private practice.

As part of their instrumental music education, each student are required to participate in one of the College music ensembles with their choice guided by the Director of Music and his/her instrumental music teacher.

Students work will be subject to report and assessment and the College recommends that parents contact the instrumental teacher or Director of Music if there are concerns about the student's progress or work.

- Students are expected to attend all the rehearsals and performances of their ensemble and absence is excused only for school excursion or illness. Unsatisfactory levels of attendance may result in the cessation of lessons.
- □ Students undertaking instrumental music studies must be able to play in the ensemble the college provides for their advancement. This will be outlined before the student undertakes to learn. The College offers the following ensembles for student performance. Not all ensembles are suitable for all students.
