

## COVID-19 ASSESSMENT

In line with our COVID Safe Plan and Public Event Tier three requirements, every visitor attending the Production of Grease must complete this COVID-19 assessment and bring it with them to the Production. We ask that if you answer yes to any of the questions you do not attend the Production, seek medical advice and follow public health advice.

This assessment will be held by the College for 28 days and provided to the Victorian Government if contact tracing is required. After 28 days, all records will be securely destroyed by the College.

## If you are feeling unwell, please stay home. Please stay home if you are showing symptoms of COVID-19 or awaiting COVD-19 results. Please help us keep our community safe.
